It states the following:

- The ADA prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in employment, State and local government, public accommodations, commercial facilities, transportation, and telecommunications.
- To be protected by the ADA, one must have a disability or have a relationship or association with an individual with a disability.
- An individual with a disability is defined by the ADA as a person who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, a person who has a history or record of such impairment, or a person who is perceived by others as having such impairment.
- The ADA does not specifically name all of the impairments that are covered.

REGULATORY STANDARD: Public Law 101-336, The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

ADA Accessibility Guidelines for Buildings and Facilities

The ADA establishes uniform requirements to make sure those work places are evaluated, and that the ADA improvements are implemented so that proper work conditions can be instituted. The following elements will be considered when facility and departmental reviews and inspections are conducted. Each element contains specific considerations for ADA compliance.

- Worksite Analysis
- Workstation Design
- Space Allowance and Reach Ranges
- Protruding Objects
- Head Room
- Ground and Floor Surfaces
